Position Summary: Healing New York (formerly NYSPCC) seeks a motivated, child- and family-centered professional to serve as a Part-Time BSW-Level Therapeutic Supervised Visitation (TSVP) Therapist. This role is designed for a Bachelor's-level social work professional who is passionate about trauma-informed, relationship-centered practice with court-involved families. The TSVP therapist plays a critical role in promoting child safety, healing, and strengthening parent-child relationships within the context of child welfare and Family Court involvement.

Key Responsibilities

- Deliver therapeutic supervised visitation services for court-involved children and families, under the guidance of licensed clinical supervisors.
- Engage and support parent-child interactions during visits by modeling developmentally appropriate, trauma-informed engagement and providing coaching and feedback to caregivers.
- Conduct intakes, visitation observations, and ongoing assessments related to family dynamics, safety, and relational needs.
- Collaborate with clinical supervisors to develop and implement therapeutic visitation plans aligned with court orders and treatment goals.
- Complete timely, accurate documentation, including visitation notes, progress summaries, and court-related reports.
- Participate in case conferences, team meetings, and multidisciplinary collaboration with attorneys, ACS/child welfare staff, and other service providers.
- Maintain professional boundaries and adherence to agency policies, court mandates, and ethical guidelines.

- Bachelor's degree in social work (BSW) or closely related human services field
- At least 1 year of experience working with children and families, preferably in: Child Welfare, Family Court-involved services, Supervised visitation programs
- Availability for evenings and weekends
